**ALL: We remember Your wounds and praise Your name.** (John 1:29)  
P: By His suffering, we are made whole.  
**ALL: We remember His wounds, and we are healed.** (1 Peter 2:24)  
P: Jesus endured all things to fulfill the will of the Father, bringing salvation to all who believe.  
**ALL: We remember His obedience and give thanks for the life He won for us.** (Hebrews 5:8-9)

## God's Word

*From Psalm 32*

Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven,  
whose sin is covered.

Blessed is the man against whom the Lord counts no iniquity,  
and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

I acknowledged my sin to You, and I did not cover my iniquity;  
I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord,"  
and You forgave the iniquity of my sin.

You are a hiding place for me; You preserve me from trouble;  
You surround me with shouts of deliverance.  
Many are the sorrows of the wicked, but steadfast love surrounds the one  
who trusts in the Lord. Be glad in the Lord, and rejoice, O righteous,  
and shout for joy, all you upright in heart!

*Responsive Reading for the Day* - Isaiah 53:3-10 [Cong. will join on selected verses]

- P: He was despised and rejected by men,  
a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief;  
and as one from whom men hide their faces  
He was despised, and we esteemed Him not.
- C: **Surely He has borne our griefs  
and carried our sorrows;  
yet we esteemed Him stricken,  
smitten by God, and afflicted.  
But He was pierced for our transgressions;  
He was crushed for our iniquities;  
upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace,  
and with His wounds we are healed.**
- P: All we like sheep have gone astray;  
we have turned -- every one -- to his own way;  
and THE LORD has laid on Him  
the iniquity of us all.  
He was oppressed, and He was afflicted,  
yet He opened not His mouth;  
like a lamb that is led to the slaughter,  
and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent,  
so He opened not His mouth.
- C: **By oppression and judgment He was taken away;  
and as for His generation, who considered  
that He was cut off out of the land of the living,  
stricken for the transgression of my people?**
- P: And they made His grave with the wicked  
and with a rich man in his death,

although He had done no violence,  
and there was no deceit in His mouth.  
Yet it was the will of THE LORD to crush Him;  
He has put Him to grief;  
when His soul makes an offering for guilt,  
He shall see His offspring; He shall prolong His days;  
the will of THE LORD shall prosper in His hand.

Matthew 20: 17-19 (please rise)

...And as Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, He took the twelve disciples aside, and on the way He said to them, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem. And the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn Him to death and deliver Him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified, and He will be raised on the third day."
