

Series Overview

Big Idea: Each week families will create a different art project to remind them of the beauty and greatness of God.

Memory Verse: “Honor the Lord for the glory of His name. Worship the Lord in the splendor of His holiness.”

Lessons:

Week 1 - Clay - With clay and a little imagination, we can mold a great many things. Families will learn that God created the universe and everything in it in just 6 days. (Genesis 1:1-27)

Materials Needed: A Bible, Modeling Clay or Play-Doh, A Blindfold, A Timer

Week 2 - Finger Painting - Finger painting can get really messy, but that’s half the fun in creating wonderful artwork. Families will learn that as we trust God in our “messy” situations, He will turn them into something wonderful. (Daniel 6:10-23)

Materials Needed: A Bible, Finger Paints, Paper, Cleaning Supplies

Week 3 - Popsicle Sticks - You can build lots of interesting projects with popsicle sticks. Families will learn that if we want to go far, we need to build our lives on the foundation of Jesus. (Matthew 7:24-27)

Materials Needed: A Bible, Popsicle/Craft Sticks, Glue, Building Blocks

Week 4 - Coloring - When we color, most of us try to stay inside the line. Families will learn that Jesus didn’t always “stay in the lines” of what people expected of Him. (Matthew 12:1-14)

Materials Needed: A Bible, 64 Pack of Crayons, Coloring books/pages

Week 5 - Collage - In collage, we take pictures and words from different places and put them together in a new and interesting way. Families will learn that although each of us is different, Jesus has put us together as one in the body of Christ. (1 Corinthians 12:12-18)

Materials Needed: A Bible, Magazines, Colored Paper, Glue Sticks, Plain Paper,

Week 6 - Paper Folding - With some creativity, even something as simple as a piece of paper can be turned into something amazing. Families will learn with God’s help, even the simplest things can be used to do big things. (1 Samuel 17:32-50)

Materials Needed: A Bible, Paper (various colors if available)
