

Pastoral Reflections..... "LET'S GIVE IT A GO"

Some things can't be compromised. My faith in my Lord and Savior Jesus will not be conceded. My love for my family will never be denied. I will never be half-hearted about wanting all people to believe the Good News of Jesus' love and sacrifice bringing life and salvation. I will not be ambivalent about supporting my flock and my friends whom God has blessed me with. Some things can't be compromised.

But some things can. I can enjoy a good meal of Chinese food though my favorite cuisine is Italian. I can listen to Luke Bryan, Miranda Lambert, Chris Stapleton and other country singers but I still prefer Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Connie Francis, et al. I can even go to a Chicago Bears game as a Packer fan and have a very good time.

St. Paul would agree some things can't be compromised but some things can be. The things that wouldn't be compromised in his life included what he only wanted to preach about: "Christ crucified; how he felt about the "foreverness" of Jesus' love: I'm convinced nothing will separate us from the love of Christ," that he wanted all people to have eternal life in heaven: "So that all people would be saved and come to a knowledge of the truth"; that he was certain a day of judgement was coming: "Don't be ignorant"; and that true joy and comfort were found in Jesus: "the God of hope fill you with joy."

But some things he felt were negotiable. It didn't matter who Baptized whom. He wasn't concerned about particular days to worship (as long as one did worship!). He didn't dwell on dietary laws or restrictions. He used multiple techniques and objects to get the Good News of Jesus out, even quoting a pagan poet and pointing to a strange altar. He explained his method of operation (M.O.) by stating: "To the Jews I became like a Jew to win the Jews.

To those under the law I became like one under the law (though I myself am not under the law), so as to win those under the law. To those not having the law I become like one not having the law (though I am not free from God's law, but am under Christ's law), so as to win those not having the law. To the weak, I become weak to win the weak. I have become all things to all men so that by all possible means I might save some." (I Corinthians 9:20-22)

Pastoral Reflections cont'd...

In hearing this, some might call Paul a hypocrite or two-faced or a "mollycoddler." But none of these are true. See Paul wasn't going to "major in the minors." His goal was to fulfill his mission proclaiming Christ and making "disciples of all nations." Of course, Paul wasn't foolish or irreverent or immoral in his evangelizing. He even said, "But all things should be done decently and in good order." (I Corinthians 14:40) However, Paul was not going to be confined to formulas of speech or constrained by popular opinion. He certainly honored tradition but was not enslaved by it. His mission was by all possible means [he] might save some.

Immanuel Lutheran Church & School's mission is this:

"Draw all people closer to the person of Jesus Christ to assure them of His gifts, namely: the endless life in heaven and the abundance of life on earth." (The abundance isn't material but rather spiritual such as: joy, peace, faith, hope, compassion, etc.)

To carry out this mission we employ various ways to proclaim the Gospel. Sometimes we have a special speaker or a special emphasis. Sometimes different instruments or singers are used to "communicate" the Gospel. Sometime we use school musicals or athletic contests or academic challenges to help others hear "Jesus is Lord."

Folks, early in my ministry I heard a seasoned Lutheran pastor assert: "Every second of every hour of everyday people are dying and going to hell because they don't know Jesus, and we waste our time fighting over things that don't matter!" Boy oh boy, that phrase has stuck with me for almost 40 years!

Yes, there are things worth fighting for. Of course, there are truths we won't surrender and there are principles and beliefs on which we won't compromise. Here's the litmus test on what to fight for: Are our contentions regarding eternal and absolutely essential things or are they just personal preferences.

I'm sure St. Paul found it extremely difficult to be "all things for all people." It's no easier for us today either. But let's give it a go regarding getting the Gospel out there to others. Oh, we will remain doing things "decently and in good order," but I say let's be bold and creative in proclaiming Jesus is Lord. We will use our talents and not bury them in the ground.

A blessed Advent and Christmas season to you and yours! It's such a marvelous time to proclaim Jesus as Lord!

Our 5-8 graders performed Sister Act Jr. at the beginning of November. It was a fabulous performance!






