In math today, we worked more with Paige the Position Pig. She introduced us to a book called *Rosie's Walk*. We heard many of our positional words in this book and even got to act out Rosie's walk with her, using our manipulative mat and a small marker. Finally, we retold Rosie's story with a cut and paste reader. Have us tell you all about *Rosie's Walk* and our positional words!

After reading the story *Goodnight Gorilla*, by Peggy Rathmann, students were presented with an engineering challenge: Can you build a bed that holds the most zoo animals? The students designed and built a bed with various materials (wooden blocks, craft sticks, legos). Students then tested their design to see how many animals it could hold.

In music today, we worked with a new instrument, *sand blocks*. We learned a new song, *The Train is Going Up the Hill*, to the tune of *All Around the Mulberry Bush*. We followed the beat with our sand blocks, and made them go up the hill, down the hill, around the lake, and they even hit a little bump. Next week, we will continue working with our sand blocks.



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
